One noteworthy sale was made to a Castro Valley High School teacher who is teaching a beginning Mandarin class. She was able to acquire, with the support of the Castro Valley Education Foundation, children's books in Chinese which were perfect for learning vocabulary. The teacher and students presented the Friends with a thank you poster—mostly in Chinese!! It's a great feeling to know that our sale had a personal impact on students at our high school.

Great news! We will have a three day Book Sale, December 2, 3, 4. Friday night, from 6-8 PM is for members only. A membership table will be available for those who wish to join that night. Halloween is a time of goblins, ghosts, and cavities for many of us. It's also our anniversary! We recently celebrated our 13th anniversary in the new building (more than 100 years in the community). On Halloween 2009 we passed books from the old library to the new location on Norbridge Ave. We called it "The Great Book Pass," and I'm so thankful to have been a part of the opening celebration. I felt the pride and community connection that day, it was wonderful!

Our Tiny Art Show was a smash success! Members picked up their tiny supplies, created their tiny art, and submitted their tiny work. All submissions were displayed in our lobby in September, and a tiny reception was held with tiny cookies and tiny popcorn.

We recently offered a wonderful program about the Ohlone People: Past, Present and Future in September. Participants were able to learn about the history and heritage of the Muwekma Ohlone Tribe and their struggle to regain federal recognition. The program was presented by Dr. Alan Leventhal, a retired professor from San Jose State University. Dr. Leventhal has spent 42 years with the tribe as an archaeologist and ethnohistorian.

We were able to secure a Homework Help facilitator! Homework Help is open to assist students with their homework. Kids sign in and start their homework. When they need help, they raise their hand, and a facilitator or volunteer comes over to help. The program has been a lifesaver for families, and we are happy it's back.

Planning is in full gear for the 6th Annual Castro Valley Reads! We are excited to share next year's title with our members. I encourage you to join our community reads event and see what happens when we all read the same book. Teasers coming soon!

Our garden is growing! Our garden programming, that is. Since early this year when ForestR.org provided the seeds and resources to start a community seed library, we've distributed over 2,000 packets of seeds to library members. The seed library continues to thrive thanks to donations of seeds from community members and ForestR.org. It's truly a community effort and it can't happen without your participation. Thanks to everyone who has donated seeds to date!

On September 24 ForestR.org presented our first in a series of gardening workshops. We learned how to harvest and save seeds from our own gardens so we can replant our gardens the following season, as well as share some of our seeds with the seed library. Upcoming workshops in our gardening series include Winter Fruit Tree Pruning and Care, Gardening 101, Preparing Your Garden for Spring, Big Gardens in Small Spaces, Eat What You Grow, Managing Garden Pests, Healthy Soil and Compost, and more. There are many vegetables that grow over the winter in the Bay Area, including beets, broccoli, carrots, chard, cauliflower, dill, kale, onions, mesclun, arugula and other

lettuces. You can find most of the library soon to choose seasonally appropriate seeds to plant in your garden!
